College Admission/Enrollment, Class of 2025

- **72%** of the Class of 2025 reported academic scholarship and award offers from colleges and other organizations. Collective value: **\$32 million**
- 100% (145 students) enrolled at 85 colleges/universities in 26 states, the District of Columbia, and four international countries (Canada, France, Ireland, Netherlands)
- 54% of students attending 48 private institutions
- 46% of students attending 37 public institutions



Holy Names Academy Percentage of Total AP Students with Scores 3 or Higher



- 94% of the 377 HNA students tested in 2025 earned a score of 3 or higher on at least one exam.
- 377 students completed 832 AP exams.
- 80% of the Class of 2025 earned AP Scholar recognition and 55% achieved the highest level of AP Scholar Award.

Championship Crew: Holy Names Academy is one of a few high schools in the Pacific Northwest states to offer crew (rowing) as a full-fledged, interscholastic sport. For 20 consecutive years, HNA crew has qualified boats to compete at the USRowing Youth National Championships—winning gold medals in 2015 and 2017, silver and bronze medals in 2019, a silver medal in 2021, and a bronze medal in 2024. HNA crew has qualified to compete for 33 consecutive years at Boston's Head of the Charles Regatta. HNA has hosted and run the Tail of the Lake Regatta for 31 consecutive years.

Clubs and Activities

Holy Names Academy offers more than 30 student-led clubs that reflect individual interests, school values, and a commitment to community. Examples of established clubs include Future Business Leaders of America, Robotics, Dessert Club, Student Review Board, and National Honor Society. The Multicultural Student Union offers seven affinity groups to cultivate a sense of belonging.
