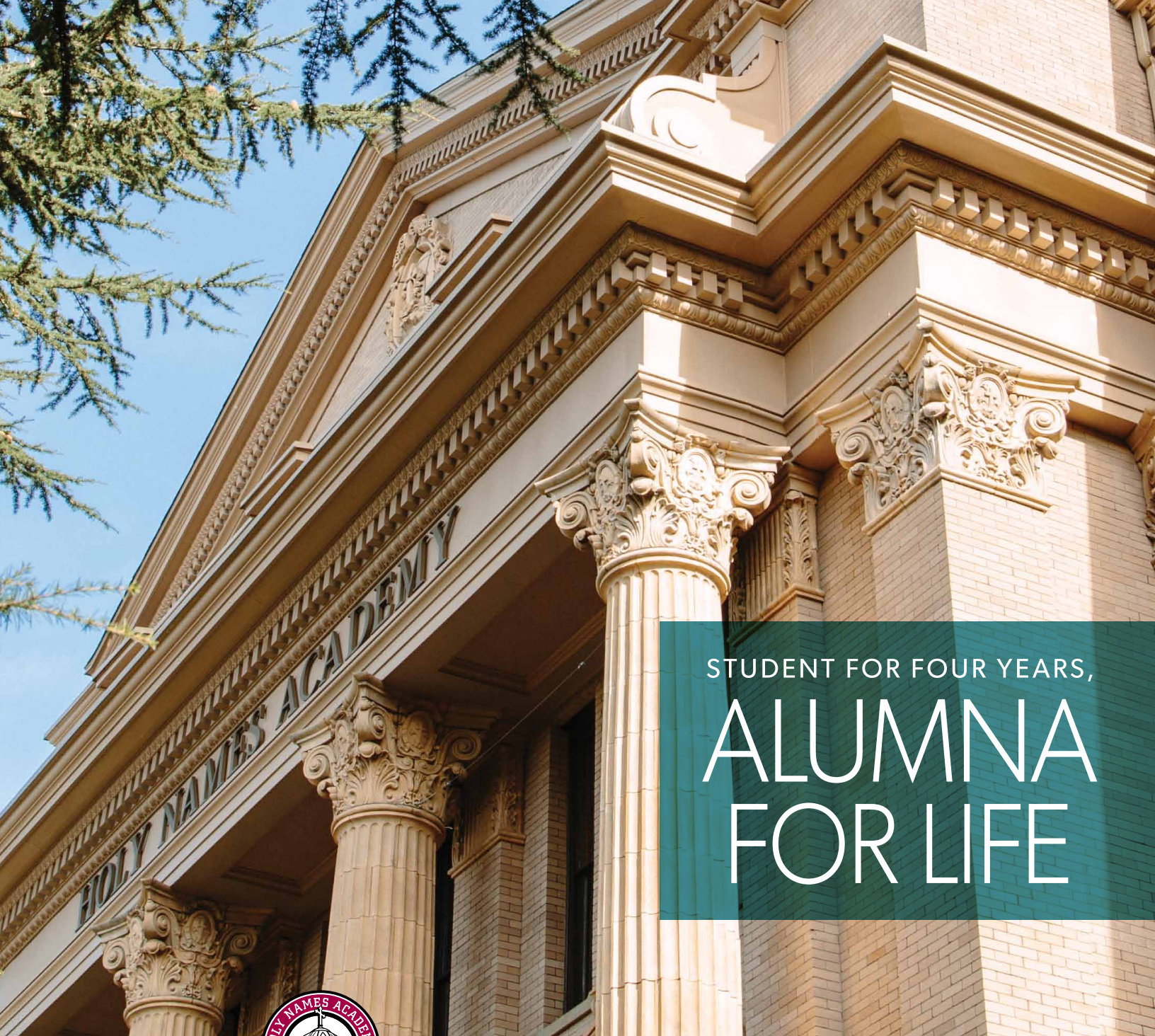

HEAD OF SCHOOL AND PRINCIPAL

GIVING

Alumnae give generously, not only of their time, but also of their resources, enabling HNA to educate young women of all economic backgrounds. In 2016-2017, an impressive **30%** of total giving came from alumnae; **24%** of active alumnae, or 1,700 donors, gave to their alma mater. HNA has 142 Named Scholarships, the majority of which are for student scholarship assistance. Of these Named Scholarships, **44%** were established by alumnae, including the current 14 Class Endowments! Alumnae also help provide for the future of the Academy by naming HNA in their estate plans; **68%** of current HNA Legacy Society Members are alumnae. They help support Deck the Dome and the CHEER! Auction; last year, alumnae accounted for about 10% of the attendance at each event. Finally, alumnae help solicit gifts from others in the community,

MENTORING

One of the many benefits of being a student and an alumna of Holy Names Academy is the access to an extraordinary network of professional women. SERVICE

Hundreds of alumnae volunteer service to the Academy and to the community. Alumnae can always be found at HNA's fall and spring Phonathons, and many volunteer at such HNA events as the Endowment Reception, Deck the Dome, and CHEER! Auction. Alumnae Board members have also volunteered to support various nonprofit organizations throughout the city, such as Jubilee Women's Center, Food Lifeline, and Race for the Cure. For the last 15 years, the Academy has hosted an annual reception at which current students receiving scholarships underwritten by HNA endowment funds can meet one-on-one with the generous donors who support endowment and with members of the HNA Legacy Society.

"We believe that you are a worthy investment in our future," **Jo-Ann Pizzello Kelly '66** told the 95 young women—and more than 100 of their benefactors—gathered in the parlors in October for this moving event.

Jo-Ann and her husband, John, members of the HNA Legacy Society, established the *John & Jo-Ann Pizzello Kelly '66 Scholarship Endowment* four years ago. "John and I support Holy Names Academy because we know the Academy is focused on providing an outstanding Catholic education for years to come to a diverse group of young women who find our school a good fit."

"Our 5,000-plus living alumnae continue their attachment by generously giving back," Jo-Ann added, "so that you and the young women of our future will continue to have educational, athletic, community service, and social experiences that will make you and them the leaders of tomorrow."

A gathering that began 15 years ago with 24 student recipients attending has grown to 90 students enjoying the opportunity to meet the benefactors of their scholarships. During the current school year, **32.4%** of HNA students and their families have received more than **\$1.4 million** worth of scholarship support.

This year's recipient of the *Janice Bakun Hyde and Patricia Gillingham Scholarship* spoke to the gathering about her passion for community service. "Holy Names Academy took that passion of mine and helped form who I am today. I really appreciate the community of wonderful people here."

What began as an assignment for this grant recipient in her Grade 9 World Cultures class grew into the inspiration for her ambitious plan to create a small library for an impoverished village in Uganda. She raised funds, procured books, and ultimately traveled with her mother to Uganda to oversee the library's assembly and opening.

"I speak on behalf of all of the students when I say, we really feel supported and cared for by you all," the student speaker told reception guests. "As I grow up, and soon leave Holy Names Academy, I plan on continuing to participate in community service to better this world. I will always look back at Holy Names Academy for everything it has taught me."

Following the reception, the annual luncheon to honor and thank endowment donors was held—for the first time—in HNA's new Mary Herche Pavilion.

GOOGLE THIS: YOUNG ALUM'S RAPID RISE IN TECH INSPIRES DONORS

Each Annual Giving season at HNA begins with a celebration for donors. More than 100 alumnae, current and alumnae parents, and current and former trustees gathered in September at Sand Point Country Club to launch the 2017-18 Annual Giving program. This year's ambitious goal is \$850,000. Annual Giving supports financial aid for over one-third of current students; enhances professional development opportunities for faculty, staff, and coaches; and maintains the historic 1908 building.

Keynote speaker **Karolina Pyszkiewicz '13** is now—just four years post-graduation from HNA—part of the Google Photos team in Mountain View, Calif. She credits her high-school alma mater for introducing her to computer science and providing her a head start into a career in the technology industry.

"With HNA's guidance," Karolina recalled at the reception, "I soon found myself in competitions, attending tech conferences, and applying to computer science programs and for my first internship at Microsoft." With industry experience already under her belt, she won direct admission to the widely renowned Computer Science Department at the University of Washington.

Karolina believes the faculty were HNA's special ingredient for her, cultivating her passion for math and science, building her confidence to try new things, and shaping the person she is now. "Donations not only fund projects, programs, and maintenance," she told the Annual Giving donors, "they support the salaries for faculty and staff to make sure that Holy Names is hiring the best and brightest teachers."

As a proud alum, Karolina enthusiastically supports the Academy and hopes to inspire others. She has hosted industry events at Google Seattle for current HNA students and recruited a recent grad as a summer intern at her government technology start-up.

Karolina's story emphasizes the importance of Annual Giving. In its truest form, the generosity of the entire HNA community nurtures nascent passions and enables students to dream bigger.

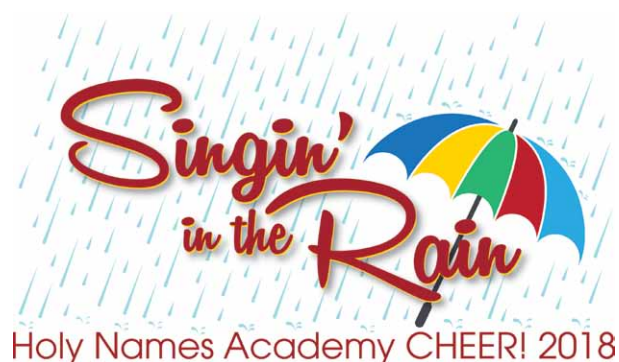

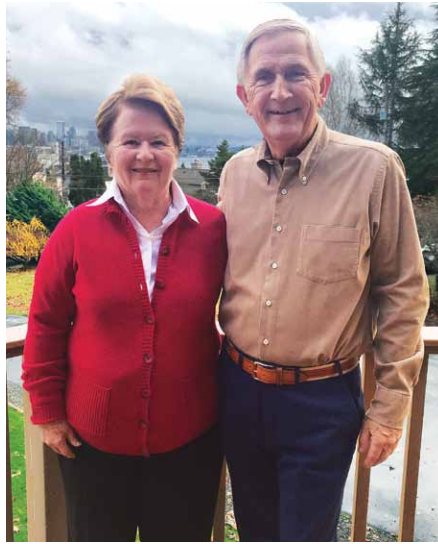
HNA LEGACY SOCIETY SPOTLIGHT
